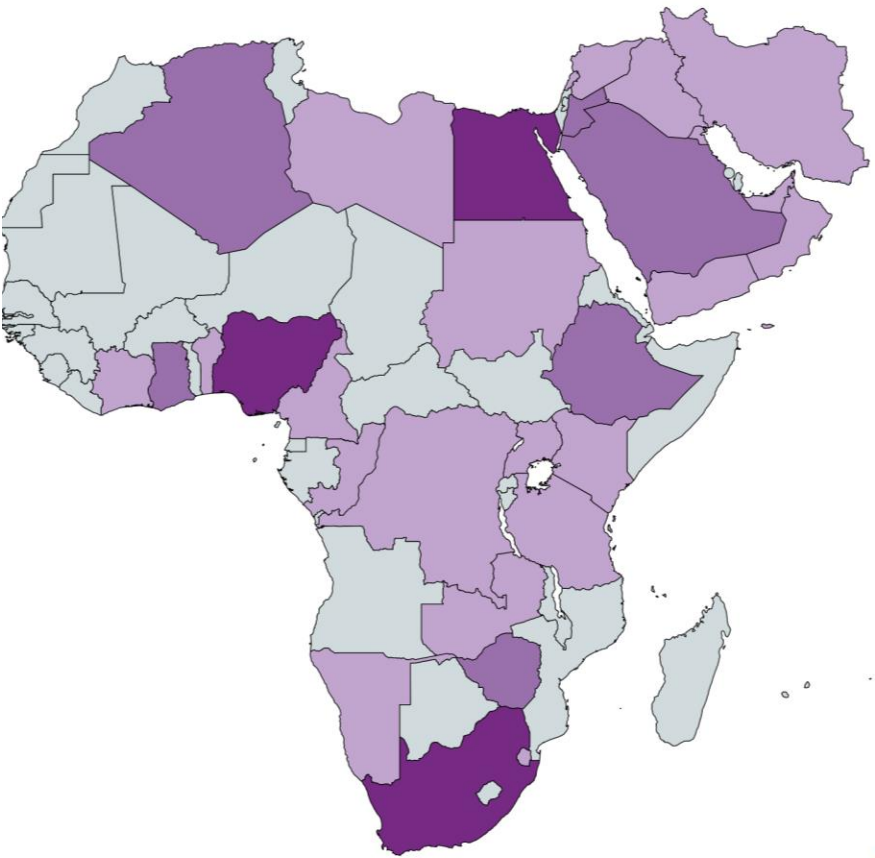

Scoping review of literature
On GBV in higher education institutions in Africa and the Middle East



Conducted in four languages
Arabic, English, French and Portuguese, and inclusive of non-English databases



Geographical inequity
Research concentrated in certain sub-regions, particularly in middle income countries



Prevalence and correlates
Most of the literature is focused on prevalence and correlates, particularly of sexual harassment



Gaps in research on policy impact
Small but growing literature on interventions and characteristics of policies, but very little on the impact of policies



Gaps in research on perpetration
Few papers focusing on perpetration and many prevalence studies don't measure type of perpetrator



Gaps in research on impacts of GBV
Some research on health impacts, but gaps in longer term educational and professional outcomes for survivors



Limited attention to intersectionality
Strong gaps in research on GBV against LGBTQI+ people, people with disabilities and other marginalised groups
