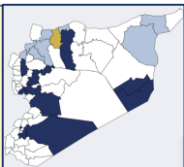

- ❑ Couple's support helps reduce IPV

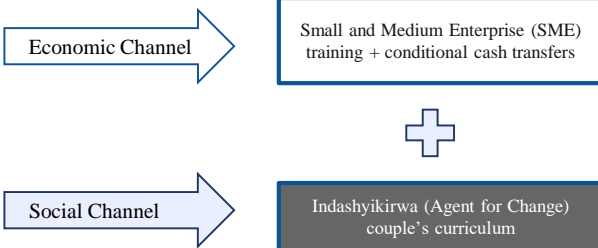
## What is unknown

- Measuring this impact in conflict settings

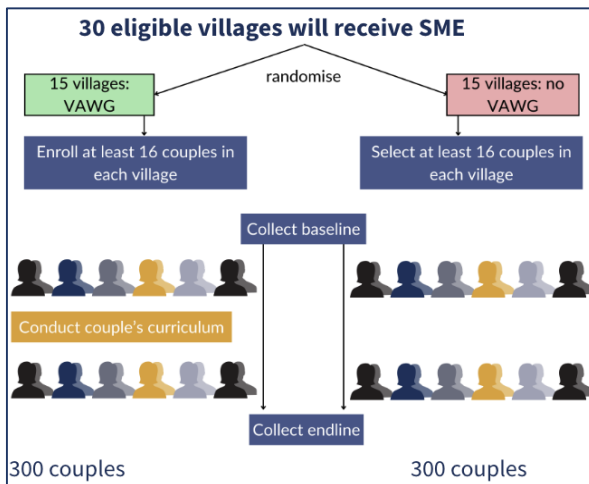
