Recommendation 1

INTEGRATING DISABILITY INTO VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN POLICIES

GBV prevention programmes need to consider and address the wider structural factors which contribute to women and girls with disabilities being at higher risk of violence.

Recommendation 2

INCLUSIVE SOCIAL NORMS CHANGE

Gender transformative programmes and social and behavioural norms change activities should be designed in collaboration with women with disabilities and their representative organisations.

Recommendation 3

ENGAGING MEN AND BOYS WITH DISABILITIES

Programmes should “support men with disabilities to re-shape their masculinities to take pride in engaging in caring roles, equal and supportive relationships and be involved parents to their children”

Recommendation 4

BUILDING THE EVIDENCE BASE

Greater investment is needed to expand the evidence base on GBV prevention among women and girls with disabilities in all their diversity.
