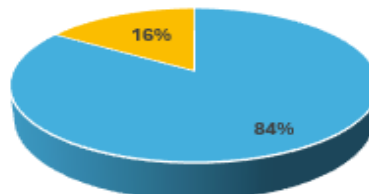

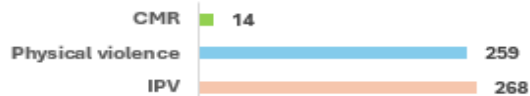
RESULT

CHALLENGES FACED BY SERVICE

- ❑ Survivors' reluctance to report due to easily traced.
- ❑ Limited GBV outreach and manpower.
- ❑ Unclear referral pathways.
- ❑ MHPSS service duplication within same catchment area
- ❑ Community lack of awareness about GBV
- ❑ Influential community members interfering forceful settling the case.
- ❑ Initiation of mobile court against GBV by government stakeholder in camp
